Inner functions and operator theory

Inner functions arose originally in an operator-theoretic context, via Beurling's characterization of the invariant subspaces of the unilateral shift. Since then, they have played important roles in a number of operatorial contexts, which we shall survey. This includes the theory of composition operators on Hardy spaces, the theory of model spaces and restricted shifts, and certain interesting questions about interpolation by analytic functions.
